

## **RESOLUTION 30-2016**

### **A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BENSON, ARIZONA, APPROVING THE APPLICATION BY THE BENSON HISTORICAL PRESERVATION COMMISSION FOR A CERTIFIED LOCAL GOVERNMENT PASS-THROUGH GRANT ADMINISTERED BY THE ARIZONA STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICE FOR ASSISTANCE IN COMPLETING AN INVENTORY OF STRUCTURES ON FOURTH STREET**

WHEREAS, the Legislature, pursuant to A.R.S. §41-511, et seq., has authorized the establishment of the CLG Pass-Through Grant Program to provide funds to the State of Arizona and other eligible applicants for the purpose of preserving historic and prehistoric resources; and

WHEREAS, the Arizona State Parks Board ("Board") is responsible for the administration of the program within the State, which has established rules and procedures governing application under the program; and

WHEREAS, said adopted procedures established by the Board require the applicant to certify by resolution the approval of applications, signature authorization, the availability of local matching funds, and authorization to sign a Participant Agreement with the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Council endeavors to raise awareness of historic preservation and the specific properties within corporate limits that may be suitable for nomination to the National Register; and

WHEREAS, completion of nomination forms is the final step in the nomination process, and the project on which the Benson Historical Commission is requesting grant funds has an estimated cost of \$4,000.00, which project is the subject of the attached Application to the Board for a grant under a program that will require a forty percent local match.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Benson hereby accepts and approves the filing of an application by the Benson Historical Preservation Commission for funding through a FY 2016 CLG Pass-Through grant in the amount of \$4,000.00 to submit nomination forms for properties along Fourth Street for the creation of a historic preservation district.



BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City of Benson hereby authorizes the Mayor to take the actions necessary for the completion of the aforementioned project.



### ***Benson Fourth Street Historic Nomination***

***Benson, Arizona was basically started by the Railroad needing a hub for shipping in Cochise County that was closer to Tucson. So they arranged an auction to sell plots to individuals wanting to be involved in the beginning of a new community in the 1880's. We are requesting a grant to finish the nomination of Benson's Fourth Street Historic District to the National Register. The survey on the 54 buildings involved has already been completed and approved by SHPO.***

***Architect, Ralph Comey, of Tucson will be doing the work for this nomination. He also did the initial survey. Mr. Comey has been working with the Benson Historic Preservation Commission for many years on other nominations, ie: Benson's Barrio District and 3<sup>rd</sup> Street Railroad District. And many other nominations handled individually. Mr. Comey will write the nomination with a history of the area and the buildings involved showing how Benson was an intricate part of the history of Cochise County, Arizona Territory, and the State of Arizona. And make maps of the lay out.***

***Mr. Comey's bid for this second half of the nomination is \$4,000.00. That would mean a match of \$1,600.00 would be made by the City of Benson. So we are asking for a 60% match from this grant to equal \$2,400.00.***

***Fourth Street was the business area and the lifeline of the community with the railroad lines directly behind the street for easy access. Benson has some of the oldest structures in the state and we are hoping to revitalize the area. There is a new housing area planned for Benson with 28,000 homes planned. And more homes planned in other locations close at hand. We feel that the Fourth Street business area could become a vital part of the growth in this area with people wanting to take these older structures and bringing our history to the forefront of Benson's growth. With this new direction we feel that people will want to shop and tour the area to get a glimpse of history and growth through time.***

***Benson's history is some of the oldest in the State. And Cochise County was a vital part of the old west. We had the Earp's, Apache Indian tribes, buffalo soldiers, Butterfield Stage lines all in this area. History was being made in Benson and all around us. People from all nationalities came to make a new start here in Benson. And we are looking to make a new start again by nominating this District to the National Register and giving it the prestige it deserves.***

***This project fits into what historic preservation is all about by highlighting the struggle of the old and the new fitting into the fabric of this community and making the old new again. With new shops and other businesses starting up it will turn this Historic business area into an exciting place to spend ones time and give new jobs to the area.***

- (e) Notifying the agency in writing, within ten calendar days after receiving notice under subparagraph (d)(2) from an employee or otherwise receiving actual notice of such conviction. Employers of convicted employees must provide notice, including position title, to every grant officer on whose grant activity the convicted employee was working, unless the Federal agency has designated a central point for the receipt of such notices. 
