At the conclusion of an open call to the public, individual members of the public body may respond to criticism made by those who have addressed the public body, may ask staff to review a matter or may ask that a matter be put on a future agenda. 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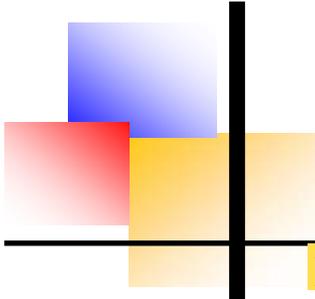

OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF BENSON, ARIZONA  
HELD DECEMBER 28, 2017 AT 7:00 P.M.  
AT CITY HALL, 120 W. 6TH STREET, BENSON, ARIZONA**

**CALL TO ORDER:**

Mayor King called the meeting to order at 7:07 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance.

**ROLL CALL:**

Present were: Mayor Toney D. King, Sr., Vice Mayor Joe Konrad, Councilmembers Pat Boyle, Larry Dempster and Levi Garner. Absent were: Councilmembers David Lambert and Lori McGoffin.

Mayor King stated both Councilmember Lambert and Councilmember McGoffin were ill.

**PUBLIC HEARING:**

Mayor King stated he would be limiting speakers' times as there were 18 people signed up to speak at the public hearing. City Clerk Vicki Vivian then stated the purpose of the public hearing will be the consideration of the application for formation of three (3) tax levying community facilities districts, adding the Council will hear comments from persons who object to the inclusion of their land in the district(s), to the formation of the districts or to the contents of the General Plan and from persons who may support the districts. Mayor King opened the public hearing at 7:09 p.m.

Tricia Gerrodette, Eagle Ridge Drive, Sierra Vista, stated it's been 3 long years and the end is in sight. Ms. Gerrodette then stated it looks to her like there are people in the audience ready to celebrate. Ms. Gerrodette then stated she sent her comments in earlier and she hopes the Council will consider them, adding she can't stress strongly enough how important she feels it would be for the Council to remain as the Board of Directors for the CFDs, noting it is within their powers and she feels it is important for the City going forward. Ms. Gerrodette then stated there are two additional pieces of information she would like in the record, adding the third-party property map in the May 24, 2016 development agreement identified some third-party properties to be added to 12,167 acres for Villages at Vigneto. Ms. Gerrodette then stated as there were no names identified on the properties, she thinks it's important the record show those, adding in the northwest corner are Larry Dempster's properties and the middle of the map shows D5 Investment properties, which was owned by the John Davis Family Trust, and in July, 2016, El Dorado Benson bought that property from the Davis family at the price of more than \$1 million. Ms. Gerrodette then stated that information is available as public records, and she is concerned about having John Davis be on the Board if the Council chooses that route.

David DiPeso, San Pedro Ranch, Benson stated he supports the Villages at Vigneto and the districts, adding the economic importance can't be overstated and then encouraged the Council to approve the districts. Mr. DiPeso then stated there needs to be continuity on the District Boards and with Council seats coming up, the Council as the Board wouldn't give continuity to keep the project going. Mr. DiPeso then stated he wanted to urge the Council to approve the districts as applied for, moving the project forward.

Alain Hartman, Airport Road, Benson, stated he is very much in support of this project, adding he has watched it evolve over the last 3 years. Mr. Hartman then stated he believes the project is going to be viewed as one of the best conceived developments in terms of its environmental sensitivity, dark skies, protection, water usage, the overall design and the open areas it will have. Mr. Hartman then stated he thinks nationally, the project is going to be recognized as a tremendous project. Mr. Hartman then stated he agrees with Mr. DiPeso that the economic impact can't be overstated, adding over the years, he's seen a lot of people come into town and a lot of businesses leave. Mr. Hartman then stated the project is going to help not only the

general area, but he thinks there will be some historic preservation opportunities happen in the downtown area. Mr. Hartman then stated he was also asked by Mark Kartchner, who couldn't be here tonight, to express Mr. Kartchner's support of the project.

Vera Gates-Williams, Paseo San Luis, Sierra Vista, stated she was excited about being a part of this project and in seeing what it is going to be for not only Benson, but Cochise County. Ms. Gates-Williams then stated she works for the Hispanic Chamber and represents Santa Cruz County. Ms. Gates-Williams then stated the amount of the impact is spoken very highly of in the Tucson area by people who just moved here in the last couple of years and are excited about being part of the growth and the impact it will have on all of southeast Arizona. Ms. Gates-Williams then stated she is definitely for this project and is hoping the Council will vote yes on the districts.

Lorraine Whaley, Whaley Road, Benson, stated she is a native of Benson and she is strongly in support of the Villages at Vigneto. Ms. Whaley then asked the Council to consider the benefits of the Villages at Vigneto compared to the developer not proceeding with the project and just selling their land. Ms. Whaley stated with the Villages at Vigneto, the City has green building, site-built homes, sidewalks, paved roads, a recharged water system, City utilities, a golf-cart friendly community, an expansion of the hospital, more medical services, more visitors for businesses, increased money in the City budget, and jobs, jobs and more jobs. Ms. Whaley continued stating there would be economic development benefits, more activities for citizens, including children, increased help for organizations such as Meals on Wheels, Benson Food Bank, thrift stores, money for parks, children-friendly activities and more money for fire and police. Ms. Whaley then stated without the Villages at Vigneto, El Dorado could sell their land and per law, divide it into 40-acre parcels, which could be bought by people who could divide it 4 times into 5 parcels to the point that there could conceivably be 3,000 parcels with 3,000 straws into the water aquifer and 3,000 septic tanks, adding it would also mean dirt roads to deal with with lots of dust. Ms. Whaley then stated when property is divided like that, which is totally legal by Arizona Real Estate law, there is no subdivision, meaning no subdivision reports would be required and the City would have quite a mess as we have had wildcat subdivisions in our area. Ms. Whaley then stated she wanted to remind the Council there has been half of a trailer on Navajo in the J6 area for years, which is lovely. Ms. Whaley continued stating there would be no expansion of the Benson Hospital, no extra jobs and no extra money, adding she thinks 4 restaurants and a western wear business have closed recently. Mayor King informed Ms. Whaley she was out of time to speak. Ms. Whaley then thanked the Council.

Lupe Diaz, S. Post Road, Benson, stated he wanted to congratulate the Council, adding they have come this far with the project after 3 years of intense work and study with their noses to the grindstone and are now almost to the finish line. Mr. Diaz then stated he wanted to encourage the Council to finish, which would mean voting yes for the districts. Mr. Diaz then stated when it comes to the Board, he wanted to encourage the Council to use private individuals who know what's going on, adding if the Council serves as the Board, elections held every 2 years can change the face of the Board continually and it doesn't make sense to do that. Mr. Diaz then stated the Council is coming to the new year and they have the ability to be able to change everything for Cochise County and other counties that will be affected by this project. Mr. Diaz then stated he was excited and congratulated the Council for their hard work. Mr. Diaz then stated he wanted to encourage the Council to do the right thing.

Jimmy Harlan, S. Cedar Place, Benson, stated like other people, he was excited about the project, adding he owns a small business in Sierra Vista. Mr. Harlan then stated he has been watching the project over the last few years with great excitement, because there is going to be a great power curve effect in what happens here. Mr. Harlan then stated everyone knows that Ft. Huachuca is a very rich resource of personnel for the project, with people who are getting out of the military, adding the project will be a great shot in the arm for them. Mr. Harlan then stated Sierra Vista will definitely gain from this; then noted he owns some property in Benson as well and he is really looking forward to all the hard work the Council has put in on the project. Mr. Harlan then stated he wanted to encourage the Council to vote yes on the districts.

Kevin Oberg, Silver, Tucson, stated he was a member of Southeast Arizona Economic Development Group, and was here tonight to congratulate Council on how far they have taken this. Mr. Oberg then stated the Council put in the required intense amount of time to structure this in a way that will ensure this project's success. Mr. Oberg then stated the structure of the community facilities districts and how the Board is going to operate is critical, adding he knows the Council worked together and knows they are in a position tonight to pass it and make 2018 an extraordinarily successful year for the City of Benson.

Lynn Mattingly, E. Hunter Creed Court, Hereford, stated it has been a long haul to get to the point where the Council is. Mr. Mattingly then stated he and his wife moved to the Hereford area in 1986 and started a family and a company called Weatherguard Metal Construction, Inc., and they have been working in Benson and the surrounding areas for 30+ years. Mr. Mattingly then stated at the time they moved here and started their business, the Sierra Vista area was thriving, but it's not thriving now, adding Cochise County has been hurting a lot as well. Mr. Mattingly then stated his employees, numbered at 18 right now, would appreciate Council approval on all agenda items regarding the Villages at Vigneto, adding his employees appreciate getting a regular paycheck, getting their health insurance paid for, and their kids would appreciate employment opportunities without having to move elsewhere. Mr. Mattingly then stated he and his wife are getting close to retirement and he would appreciate the chance to live in a well-designed community, such as the Villages at Vigneto and the Council voting yes will go a long way toward helping all of this come to pass.

John Jenetto, Indian Wells, Tucson, stated his family has owned land in Benson since 1953. Mr. Jenetto then stated he wasn't sure he was going to be able to attend, so he sent the Council an email expressing his thoughts about the project and how they would like to see the community facilities districts managed. Mr. Jenetto then stated as an old attorney, he gets sensitive about liability issues and he looked at this issue from the standpoint of the districts being truly independent of the City Council management of this project. Mr. Jenetto then stated the Council is going to change over the many years it takes to develop this project and he thinks the districts are looking for continuity and should be totally independent of Council decisions in the event that a conflict of interest may arise over some issue relative to the project. Mr. Jenetto then stated he also wanted to commend the Council on their courage for the past votes they have taken in regard to this project. Mr. Jenetto then stated he has dealt with Mike Reinbold in the past and these people go above and beyond any expectations he's ever seen from developers to make something come to pass, adding he thinks the development will truly be a project that Benson can be proud of and the Council will be recognized. Mr. Jenetto then stated the development will be something that everyone can say they were part of it. Mr. Jenetto then stated he would like to close his remarks with a quote a family member shared with him that was attributed to John F. Kennedy, "Change is the law of life and those who look only to the past or present are certain to miss the future." Mr. Jenetto then stated Benson shouldn't miss the future, the future is now, adding everyone should look to the future and see Benson prosper.

Daniel Valle, Fry Boulevard, Sierra Vista stated he was the International Director of the Sierra Vista Hispanic Chamber of Commerce; an affiliate of the Tucson Hispanic Chamber. Mr. Valle then stated Benson is a city that falls within the Sierra Vista Hispanic Chamber's region and on behalf of Lea Márquez-Peterson, their President and CEO, he would like to inform the Council that they wholeheartedly support the Villages at Vigneto project. Mr. Valle then stated they believe it will be an economic boon for Benson and Cochise County, based on the following projections over 18 years provided by economicresearch.com and Dr. Robert Carreira. Mr. Valle then quoted the study, stating the economic contribution to the Cochise County economy will be \$23.8 billion in economic output spending sales within Cochise County; \$7.7 billion in house-flow earnings and will provide 16,355 jobs at the peak of the development. Mr. Valle then continued, stating the tax revenue to local governments will be \$1.5 billion for all taxing districts, \$557.6 million for the City of Benson, \$295.3 million for Cochise County and \$32.9 million for Cochise County municipalities other than Benson. Mr. Valle then stated others to benefit as well include the Benson and St. David School Districts, the San Pedro Valley Hospital, Cochise College and the Cochise County Joint Technical Education District. Mr. Valle then stated given these figures, it's possible that spin-off businesses will also be created or will move into Cochise County to support the project, therefore, they believe that

overall the Villages at Vigneto will be good for the economies of Benson, Cochise County and Arizona and he urged the Council to vote for this project.

George Scott, 4th Street, Benson, stated he was representing the Southeast Arizona Economic Development Group. Mr. Scott then stated he didn't know what else he could say, noting a lot of people said everything he wanted to say, but he did want to thank the Council and the Staff, including Mr. Stephens and the attorneys for the work they have put into this to help the Council come to a decision tonight. Mr. Scott then stated they believe all the items on the agenda regarding the El Dorado boards should be approved. Mr. Scott then stated this has come a long way and it's time to get the project started, adding he thinks it will get started early in the new year. Mr. Scott then stated again, he wanted to encourage the Council to vote yes on the agenda items for El Dorado Holdings.

Jim Broom, Ocotillo, Benson, stated he's been a resident or a business operator and owner for 37 years in Benson. Mr. Broom then stated everyone stole his thunder, so he was not going to waste time, but he wanted the Council to know he supports the Villages at Vigneto and he wanted to thank the Council for the work they've done.

Mike Foundy, Oak, Arlington, Virginia, stated he would probably get the award for coming the farthest, noting he was from Arlington, VA. Mr. Foundy then stated he actually started in Cochise County, adding he was born in Douglas and was raised in Bisbee. Mr. Foundy then stated he was one of Cochise County's major exports since the copper mines in Bisbee and the smelter in Douglas were closed, noting people who can't make a living here often leave. Mr. Foundy then stated he was eager to come back and he thinks the Council is making it possible and he really wanted to commend the work this Council and previous Councils have done. Mr. Foundy then stated this is the second meeting he's attended because he's been following the project and he is eager to potentially acquire a home here and return to his roots. Mr. Foundy then stated someone said something that was very important to him personally, because his father sold their ranch, which was about 20 sections, west of Bisbee. Mr. Foundy stated when the ranch was sold, there was no master plan, no developer like El Dorado and now it's exactly the way Loreen Whaley described it; a bunch of 40-acre parcels, dirt roads and it's a mess and it's ugly. Mr. Foundy stated Benson has done the right thing by working through these years since El Dorado bought the property and the City Council has done a great job, but the community facilities districts need to go forward. Mr. Foundy then stated he thinks it's critically important the districts be managed independently of the political process, because the last time he was at a Council meeting, there were a lot of different faces on the Council, adding next year, there will probably be new people on the Council. Mr. Foundy then stated the community improvement district project should be managed carefully by people who are here for the long run and the best thing the Council could do is assure that happens by appointing people who aren't going to be subject to the will of the people and the whims of opinion. Mr. Foundy then stated he thinks that within 10 years, people who don't like this project are going to say it's a great project and they love it. Mr. Foundy then stated eventually, everyone will support the project even if they originally opposed it, because they will come to think it's a great project. Mr. Foundy then stated these things have a way of building momentum and he thinks the Council has done an admirable job and has done the right thing, adding this project is not going to be like the wildcat development on his family's land west of Bisbee.

Mahlon MacKenzie, Mescal Road, Benson, stated he was a third-generation native and was currently representing the Chamber of Commerce. Mr. MacKenzie then stated for all the reasons that have been stated and those to come, they were strongly in favor of going forward and getting a good Board that will be consistent and getting this project up and running. Mr. MacKenzie urged the Council to vote in favor and thanked them for their time.

Jeff Cook, Huachuca Street, Benson, stated there are a lot of people here supporting the development and they made some emotional arguments, adding he especially appreciated Lorene Whaley, noting she spoke the most intelligently about the effects of this development. Mr. Cook then stated the only thing he wanted to address is whether this is going to be the Council doing due diligence or if the Council will fall prey to the political slogans of "give the developer anything they want, it will be good for Benson." Mr. Cook then

stated he brought a lot of documents including things from Stifel Nicolaus, the development agreement for the Villages, the 100-year water advocacy certificate, the final community master plan for the Villages, the hard copy of the application for the formation of the community facilities districts 1, 2 and 3 and Hilltop's supposed review of that, the hard copy of the application for the formation of the Villages revitalization districts 1-7 and the supposed review by Hilltop of that. Mr. Cook then stated the point he was trying to bring up is that this is an enormous amount of material and in order for the Council to do due diligence as elected representatives from the citizens of Benson, they need to be able to read these documents. Mr. Cook then stated in addition, there is a 192-page legal report from the Arizona Corporation Commission that talks about Mike Reinbold, the \$60 million judgment against him that he thinks is referred to as financial fraud, adding he is not saying it was either way, but the Council needs to look into it for themselves. Mr. Cook then stated another part of that report refers to Mr. Reinbold for shareholder liability based on the milking of corporate assets, adding he wrote that down word for word, so if he was sued for repeating it, it would be a frivolous lawsuit. Mayor King notified Mr. Cook he was out of time to speak.

Jerry DeGrazia, Painted Quail Place, Tucson, stated he is on the Southeast Arizona Economic Development Group and is also a landowner with a company called San Pedro Partners, LLC. Mr. DeGrazia then compared the Council to a football team, stating the Council hasn't voted, they are 99 yards down the field and it's 4th and 1 yard, adding those 99 yards they made are composed of all the information just shown to the Council a few seconds ago. Mr. DeGrazia then stated the Council has done their due diligence, adding they have worked on this for 3 years. Mr. DeGrazia then stated he would like to pretend that he was the coach and was handing the Council the play, stating he would like them to all run across that goal line tonight and approve this once and for all so we can get this town and community going. Mr. DeGrazia then stated he's really looking forward to seeing that happen and he would love to have a bottle of vino from Vigneto to toast to it. Mr. DeGrazia then thanked the Council.

Donald Fenn, Benson, stated he would like to leave a few words with the Council tonight. Mr. Fenn then stated he was born and raised in the Benson area and he's been in business for construction and excavation for the last 50 years. Mr. Fenn stated he did the first groundbreaking in Mescal and J6, adding when he started J6, Mescal and J6 only had one ranch house each. Mr. Fenn then stated things then happened and that's what we want: continued progress. Mr. Fenn then stated he was in support of the development.

Mayor King stated there was no one else signed up to speak; then asked if anyone else present would like to speak, including Mr. Reinbold, noting he would like to give everyone a chance before closing the hearing. After receiving no responses, Mayor King closed the Public Hearing at 7:41 p.m.

Vice Mayor Konrad moved to enter into an executive session with the Mayor and Council, the City Manager, the City Attorneys, the Public Works Director, the Financial Advisor Mr. Givens and the City Clerk at 7:42 p.m. Mayor King asked if Vice Mayor Konrad wanted to include Mr. Ken Gukenberger, the community facilities district counsel, who was on the phone. Vice Mayor Konrad added Mr. Gukenberger to his motion. City Attorney Paul Loucks asked if Vice Mayor Konrad wanted to include the additional Financial Advisor, Ms. Gold with Vice Mayor Konrad stating that would be appropriate. Seconded by Councilmember Dempster. Motion passed Motion passed 5-0.

Council reconvened at 8:42 p.m.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

### **1. Discussion and possible action regarding the renewal of a contract for an Airport Services Coordinator with David Thompson**

Public Works Director Brad Hamilton stated this contract has been in place for a year and is now up for renewal, adding Staff is recommending renewal of the contract as it is working out very well. Mr. Hamilton then stated there is an increase in the cost of the contract; however, it is still below the other nearest proposal the City received.

Councilmember Boyle moved to approve the renewal of the contract for an Airport Services Coordinator with David Thompson. Seconded by Vice Mayor Konrad. Motion passed 5-0.

### **2. Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 37-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, authorizing execution of an Intergovernmental Agreement between the State of Arizona for the Department of Administration – General Accounting Office, and the City for hosting and publication of the City’s financial data**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated the attached Interagency Agreement will renew the contract we currently have with the Arizona Department of Administration-General Accounting Office to provide hosting and publication of the City’s financial data on the State of Arizona’s official transparency website called Arizona OpenBooks ([www.openbooks.az.gov](http://www.openbooks.az.gov)) through December 31, 2025. Mr. Stephens then stated effective January 1, 2013, A.R.S.§ 41-725 required local governments to report all revenues and expenditures over \$5,000 on a website free of charge to the public. Mr. Stephens then stated this website must present this information in an intuitive manner to the user and it must allow the user to search, aggregate, and download the information and it must contain the manner of payment, funding source, date and amount of payment, payee name, and applicable contract information. Mr. Stephens then stated the website would exclude sensitive and confidential information, such as individual tax payments, information subject to attorney-client confidentiality, or any other information designated confidential by law. Mr. Stephens then stated this information must be updated quarterly and the Finance Department has looked into different options for complying with this new requirement and the most efficient and cost-effective option is to host our information on the State’s transparency website. Mr. Stephens then stated by using the State’s transparency reporting website, we will avoid the time and costs associated with developing our own website and it is available to us now, adding we are currently using it. Mr. Stephens then stated the state is offering their website as an option to all cities, counties, and school districts, adding the GAO has a large number of participants. Mr. Stephens then stated though the contract reads the costs include an initial set-up fee of \$2,000 in addition to the annual operating costs of \$1,000 a year for 8 years, the City Clerk has confirmed the initial set-up fee was actually paid in 2013 and will not be charged again. Mr. Stephens then stated Staff is asking to have the motion include the stipulation to only pay the annual fee for operating costs, which is \$1,000 a year for the next 8 years through December 31, 2025.

Councilmember Garner moved to approve Resolution 37-2017 only paying the annual costs as noted by the City Manager and not paying the initial set up fee. Seconded by Councilmember Boyle. Motion passed 5-0.

### **3. Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 38-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, authorizing execution of a Development Agreement between the City of Benson, Arizona the Special Taxing District known as The Villages at Vigneto Revitalization District No. 1, and El Dorado Benson relating to the development of The Villages at Vigneto**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated this is the first of the next 7 resolutions of this type, noting they all read the same, but will be for different revitalization districts 1-7; agenda items 3 through 9. Mr. Stephens then stated in October 2017, El Dorado Benson applied to the City to form 7 special taxing districts over the Vigneto project, adding if formed, these districts, known by the statutes authorizing their formation as revitalization districts, would have the ability to levy special assessments and/or ad valorem taxes upon the

several lots in the subject property in order to pay the costs of (a) the formation and operation of the District, (b) the construction of infrastructure improvements to be financed, constructed and acquired by the District, and (c) the operation and maintenance of such infrastructure improvements. Mr. Stephens then stated before adopting a resolution approving the revitalization districts, City staff asks the Mayor and Council to approve new development agreements for each district, which deal essentially with three issues: establishing a requirement that the developer fund the district until it generates enough revenue through its assessments to sustain its operations; the requirement that the developer and the district indemnify the City from certain formation and administrative functions; and allow the District and the City to use each other's procurement functions through a cooperative purchasing arrangement with aim of increasing the buying power of the combined entities. Mr. Stephens then stated Staff had asked the Mayor to place an Executive Session on the agenda so that counsel could provide legal advice for any such questions the Mayor and Council had regarding these development agreements and the executive session was held. Mayor King then asked if there was any discussion. Vice Mayor Konrad then moved to approve Resolution 38-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Garner. Motion passed 5-0. City Attorney Paul Loucks stated he wanted to clarify that the Council was approving the amended versions that were sent to the Council earlier.

4. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 39-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, authorizing execution of a Development Agreement between the City of Benson, Arizona the Special Taxing District known as The Villages at Vigneto Revitalization District No. 2, and El Dorado Benson relating to the development of The Villages at Vigneto**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated the information was the same for this item. Mayor King asked Staff to clarify if anything changed as they went through these items. Vice Mayor Konrad asked City Attorney Paul Loucks to briefly address the amendments sent to the Council, so the public was aware of them. Mr. Loucks stated the amendments sent to the Council on Tuesday were: the cover page for the revitalization districts development agreements had an extra word in the district's name "Vigneto Community Revitalization District", noting the word "community" was removed; in the opening paragraph of the development agreement, part of a sentence in all caps used to read "this district development, and intergovernmental agreement" noting the comma was removed; the same page, in Section 1.1 of the proposed development agreement, there was a statutory reference to Title 46, which is the taxing statutes in Arizona, changed to reference Title 48, which is the special taxing districts statutes; then in 7 places throughout the revitalization district development agreements, the agreement referred to the CFD act, for example in Section 1.6 and several places below, it was changed to say it was referring to the revitalization districts act. Vice Mayor Konrad stated he just wanted it to be clear that the Council was advised of these amendments prior to the meeting and he wanted to make sure everyone was aware what the amendments were. Vice Mayor Konrad then moved to approve Resolution 39-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Dempster. Motion passed 5-0.

5. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 40-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, authorizing execution of a Development Agreement between the City of Benson, Arizona the Special Taxing District known as The Villages at Vigneto Revitalization District No. 3, and El Dorado Benson relating to the development of The Villages at Vigneto**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated there was no change in the discussion. Vice Mayor Konrad moved to approve Resolution 40-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Boyle. Motion passed 5-0.

6. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 41-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, authorizing execution of a Development Agreement between the City of Benson, Arizona the Special Taxing District known as The Villages at Vigneto Revitalization District No. 4, and El Dorado Benson relating to the development of The Villages at Vigneto**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated again, there were no changes to the discussion. Councilmember Boyle moved to approve Resolution 41-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Garner. Motion passed 5-0.

7. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 42-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, authorizing execution of a Development Agreement between the City of Benson, Arizona the Special Taxing District known as The Villages at Vigneto Revitalization District No. 5, and El Dorado Benson relating to the development of The Villages at Vigneto**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated there were no changes to the discussion. Vice Mayor Konrad moved to approve Resolution 42-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Boyle. Motion passed 5-0.

8. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 43-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, authorizing execution of a Development Agreement between the City of Benson, Arizona the Special Taxing District known as The Villages at Vigneto Revitalization District No. 6, and El Dorado Benson relating to the development of The Villages at Vigneto**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated again, there were no changes to the discussion. Mayor King moved to approve Resolution 43-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Dempster. Motion passed 5-0.

9. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 44-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, authorizing execution of a Development Agreement between the City of Benson, Arizona the Special Taxing District known as The Villages at Vigneto Revitalization District No. 7, and El Dorado Benson relating to the development of The Villages at Vigneto**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated this item is the last of the revitalization district development agreements and there were no changes to the discussion. Councilmember Boyle moved to approve Resolution 44-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Garner. Motion passed 5-0.

10. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 45-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, ordering and declaring formation of The Villages at Vigneto Revitalization District No. 1 in the City of Benson, Arizona**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated as City Clerk just stated, these items are to form the revitalization districts. Mr. Stephens then stated in October 2017, El Dorado Benson applied to the City to form seven special taxing districts over the Vigneto project and if formed, these districts, known by the statutes authorizing their formation as revitalization districts, would have the ability to levy special assessments and/or ad valorem taxes upon the several lots in the subject property in order to pay the costs of (a) the formation and operation of the District, (b) the construction of infrastructure improvements to be financed, constructed and acquired by the District, and (c) the operation and maintenance of such infrastructure improvements. Mr. Stephens then stated the Mayor and Council have adopted policies regarding the information Staff has recommended to be reviewed prior to the adoption of a resolution forming the taxing districts. Mr. Stephens then stated this action on formation is only effective for properties located wholly within the City boundaries, and it is believed that all subject property meets that condition. Mr. Stephens then stated Staff has reviewed the statutory requirements for formation and the options about how formation would proceed if Mayor and Council approve this Resolution, e.g., whether an election is required, and Staff believes that the application complies with all statutory requirements. Mr. Stephens then stated Staff further believes that public necessity and convenience will be furthered through formation of the special taxing districts, as it will better allow growth to pay for itself. Mr. Stephens then stated the Council should note that the applicant also applied for the formation of overlapping community facilities districts, which the Council will get to after the 7 revitalization districts, a separate type of special taxing district. Mr. Stephens then stated from the respective applications, Staff believes that the districts are intended essentially to have overlapping taxation authority to allow the districts to better separate costs that are incurred for more localized improvements, e.g., a neighborhood improvement, while allowing flexibility to assess a greater number of district residents for improvements with broader purposes, such as community centers. Mr. Stephens then stated the ultimate amount of debt the districts can issue will depend on market conditions and the property values. Mr. Stephens then stated the Council had the executive session as set forth, adding this information will be the same for the next 7 items with regard to actually forming the revitalization districts 1-7.

Vice Mayor Konrad moved to approve Resolution 45-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Boyle. Mayor King asked if there was any discussion. Vice Mayor Konrad stated he believes this outlines why there are so many districts and why there are different kinds of districts, adding that has been asked by several people, but Mr. Stephens statement was clear on what the reasons were. Motion passed 5-0.

11. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 46-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, ordering and declaring formation of The Villages at Vigneto Revitalization District No. 2 in the City of Benson, Arizona**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated the information for this item was the same. Councilmember Boyle moved to approve Resolution 46-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Garner. Motion passed 5-0.

12. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 47-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, ordering and declaring formation of The Villages at Vigneto Revitalization District No. 3 in the City of Benson, Arizona**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated there was no change in the discussion for this item. Councilmember Garner moved to approve Resolution 47-2017. Seconded by Vice Mayor Konrad. Motion passed 5-0.

City Clerk Vicki Vivian stated the Council was addressing Resolution 49-2017. Vice Mayor Konrad corrected his motion to approve Resolution 49-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Dempster. Motion passed 5-0.

City Manager Bill Stephens stated this item was the last revitalization district to be considered and there were no changes in the discussion. Vice Mayor Konrad moved to approve Resolution 51-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Boyle. Motion passed 5-0.

17. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 52-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, authorizing execution of a Development Agreement between the City of Benson, Arizona the Special Taxing District known as The Villages at Vigneto Community Facilities District**

**No. 1, and El Dorado Benson relating to the development of The Villages at Vigneto**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated this is the first of 3 of the development agreements for the community facilities districts. Mr. Stephens then stated in October 2017, El Dorado Benson applied to the City to form three special taxing districts over the Vigneto project and if formed, these districts, known by the statutes authorizing their formation as community facilities districts, would have the ability to levy special assessments and/or ad valorem taxes upon the several lots in the subject property in order to pay the costs of (a) the formation and operation of the District, (b) the construction of infrastructure improvements to be financed, constructed and acquired by the District, and (c) the operation and maintenance of such infrastructure improvements. Mr. Stephens then stated before adopting a resolution approving the community facilities districts, City Staff asks the Mayor and Council to approve new development agreements for each district. Vice Mayor Konrad stated that is correct for his previous motion. Mayor King then moved to approve Resolution 53-2017. Seconded by Vice Mayor Konrad. Motion passed 5-0.

19. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 54-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, authorizing execution of a Development Agreement between the City of Benson, Arizona the Special Taxing District known as The Villages at Vigneto Community Facilities District No. 3, and El Dorado Benson relating to the development of The Villages at Vigneto**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated there was no change to the discussion. Councilmember Boyle moved to approve Resolution 54-2017. Seconded by Vice Mayor Konrad. Motion passed 5-0.

20. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 55-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, declaring intent to form a Community Facilities District; ordering and declaring formation of The Tax Levying The Villages at Vigneto Community Facilities District No. 1 in the City of Benson, Arizona**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated this item is the action to form the community facilities district number 1 and two other district formations will be following. Mr. Stephens then stated in October 2017, El Dorado Benson applied to the City to form three special taxing districts over the Vigneto project and if formed, these districts, known by the statutes authorizing their formation as community facilities districts, would have the ability to levy special assessments and/or ad valorem taxes upon the several lots in the subject property in order to pay the costs of (a) the formation and operation of the District, (b) the construction of infrastructure improvements to be financed, constructed and acquired by the District, and (c) the operation and maintenance of such infrastructure improvements. Vice Mayor Konrad stated on the written Council communication, the first sentence of the 4th paragraph read revitalization districts instead of community facilities districts.

Councilmember Boyle moved to approve Resolution 55-2017. Seconded by Vice Mayor Konrad. Motion passed 5-0.

21. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 56-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, declaring intent to form a Community Facilities District; ordering and declaring formation of The Tax Levying The Villages at Vigneto Community Facilities District No. 2 in the City of Benson, Arizona**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated there was no change to the discussion. Councilmember Garner moved to approve Resolution 56-2017. Seconded by Mayor King. Motion passed 5-0.

22. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 57-2017 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, declaring intent to form a Community Facilities District; ordering and declaring formation of The Tax Levying The Villages at Vigneto Community Facilities District No. 3 in the City of Benson, Arizona**

City Manager Bill Stephens stated this is the last of the community facilities districts formation, and there was no change to the discussion. Vice Mayor Konrad moved to approve Resolution 57-2017. Seconded by Councilmember Dempster. Motion passed 5-0.

23. **Discussion and possible action to ratify the vote of Mayor and Council taken on December 11, 2017 to not refer the petitions for formation of special taxing districts to Stifel Nicolaus for review**

City Attorney Paul Loucks stated on December 11, 2017, Item 3 under New Business was noticed as follows: *Discussion and possible direction to staff regarding the City's use of Stifel, Nicolaus and Company, Inc. to review and advise the City on the special taxing district applications submitted by El Dorado Benson regarding the Vigneto Project.*

Mr. Loucks then stated the motion was seconded and approved by a majority of the City Council and following the meeting, various staff members in discussion with members of the community, were advised that there could be an open meetings law complaint lodged with the Attorney General over the form of the motion under the theory that it exceeded the action that was noticed on the agenda. thirty days of the original action, adding if the original action fell outside of an authorized action, ratification may be used to correct any oversight. Mr. Loucks then stated a motion to ratify could simply be stated as: I move to ratify the December 11, 2017 action of the Mayor and Council not to refer to Stifel Nicolaus the applications for formation of Special Taxing Districts regarding the Vigneto Project.

Vice Mayor Konrad moved to ratify the December 11, 2017 action of the Mayor and Council not to refer to Stifel Nicolaus the applications for formation of Special Taxing Districts regarding the Vigneto Project. Seconded by Mayor King. Motion passed 5-0.

Councilmember Lambert moved to approve the Consent Agenda. Seconded by Councilmember Boyle. Motion passed 7-0.

### **2. Discussion and possible action to direct Staff to engage the Benson Future Business Leaders of Arizona (FBLA) for the benefit of the community and to further student education**

Interim City Manager Vicki Vivian stated this item is on the agenda at the request of Councilmember Dempster, who has served as a business advisor to the Future Business Leaders of Arizona (FBLA) in the past. Ms. Vivian then stated she reached out to the FBLA Sponsor Megan Moreno at the Benson High School who expressed interest in having the FBLA partner with the City for such opportunities and in being the liaison between the City and the FBLA. Ms. Vivian then stated Ms. Moreno also expressed interest in working with Ms. Lamb as an additional liaison/chaperone for the Youth Council, should it be approved. Ms. Vivian then stated she also contacted Mr. Micha Mortenson, the Superintendent of the Benson School District on Friday afternoon and she expects to receive a response that is supportive of this endeavor, adding she will notify the Council as soon as she receives a response.

After a brief discussion, Councilmember Dempster stated he would like to withdraw this item, which died for lack of a motion.

### **3. Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 5-2018 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, establishing a Youth Council and encouraging the participation of Benson and St. David High School Students**

Interim City Manager Vicki Vivian stated the City Council recently received a letter from Ms. Kaileigh Thompson requesting the creation of a Youth Council, adding Ms. Thompson feels a Youth Council would help the youth work closely with influential members of the community, gain leadership skills they could not get anywhere else, and understand the importance of working hard and being involved in their community. Ms. Vivian then stated in addition, Ms. Thompson feels it would provide the participating youth with volunteer opportunities that allow them to assist the City and learn how our City operates. Ms. Vivian then stated after the Council received Ms. Thompson's letter, several Councilmembers, including Mayor King, Vice Mayor Konrad and Councilmember Lambert contacted her about creating a Youth Council. Ms. Vivian then stated Councilmember Lambert championed this idea in 2011, but when she contacted the school at that time, the Administrator felt there would not be the needed participation due to the students being involved in many year-round activities. Ms. Vivian then stated when Councilmember Lambert received the letter, he contacted Ms. Linda Lamb, who offered to serve as a liaison for the Youth Council, adding Councilmember Lambert then had a meeting with Ms. Lamb and Ms. Thompson arranged to discuss the Youth Council in more detail. Ms. Vivian then stated she also communicated with Mr. Micha Mortenson, the Superintendent of the Benson School District and received a response that is supportive of the Youth Council. Ms. Vivian then stated the proposed resolution to create the Youth Council approves Ms. Thompson as the Chair and will allow her to work with City Staff and

School District personnel to formally establish the Youth Council and begin its operation. If approved, Staff will contact Ms. Thompson and the Council will be kept up-to-date on the progress and activity of the Youth Council.

Councilmember Lambert then opened the floor for discussion and stated Ms. Kaileigh Thompson is present for questions.

Mayor King asked Ms. Thompson why she feels she would like to start a Youth Council with Ms. Thompson stating she wants something to outlast her in her high school career and wants students to get involved in more than one club.

Vice Mayor Konrad asked if Ms. Thompson could give the Council a rundown on the process to create the Youth Council with Ms. Thompson stating there will be an application process for Benson High School, St. David High School, home schooled students and 8th graders who will be in High School next year, adding students will fill out the application and City Staff will choose members and officers. Vice Mayor Konrad asked about the timeline with Ms. Thompson stating she would like everyone appointed and to know what they're doing by the end of the summer. Councilmember Lambert stated it was put on the agenda now, so the Council can have it put together by the Legal of Arizona Cities & Towns Annual Conference.

Councilmember Garner stated until a couple weeks ago, he had never heard of a Youth Council and asked what Youth Councils do with Ms. Thompson stating the Youth Council is similar to a Student Council but is for the entire City and will do what their City will allow.

Councilmember Dempster asked how much money the Youth Council will need with Ms. Thompson stating she was not sure, but it wouldn't be very much. Councilmember Dempster asked if the expenditures could be a line item in the City's financials, then stated he was a little confused and asked if the school administration was fully aware of this and knew what it was. Councilmember Dempster then asked if the school supported it and was going to fund with Ms. Thompson stating Micha Mortenson approves of it, but the school will not be as involved as the City will and will not be funding it or be responsible for it, adding it will be up to the members of the Youth Council and the City.

Councilmember Dempster asked if the trips the Youth Council makes or the projects they will do be within the community, if they will come to Council meetings and what it is that the Youth Council will do with Ms. Thompson stating the Youth Council will do volunteer work for the City, they will be attending City meetings to learn how the City operates and to learn what the City Council does.

Mayor King stated the Youth Council will basically gain an outlook on what City government is all about and what happens in different areas of the City, adding they will learn about what each one of our jobs is all about and what the Council does.

Ms. Thompson said the Youth Council will be mimicking what the City Council does and will have officers and Councilmembers, adding they will learn through their own experience by following the Council. Mayor King asked Ms. Thompson if she was aware that some Council meetings could last until 10:00 p.m., adding he wants to make sure the students and their parents know with Ms. Thompson saying she is aware of that, and if students are willing to make the commitment to be on the Youth Council, they will have to make the commitment and stick by it.

Ms. Vivian stated that could be something addressed on the application process as well. Mayor King asked if the Youth Council could have an area by the dias to sit next to the City Council during the meetings with Ms. Vivian stating it was possible, if the Council chose to do so. Councilmember Boyle asked how the members would be elected and if it would be from campaigning or would be anyone who wants to volunteer with Ms. Thompson stating there will be an application process to go through. Ms. Thompson then stated the hope is that the City staff will appoint them, adding the students will have to apply and prove they are worth being part of the Youth Council. Councilmember Boyle asked if there will be a limit to how many people can participate with Ms. Thompson stating the details haven't been worked out yet, but she is hoping to pick 5-7 officers for an odd-number for voting and she was not sure how many members will be approved.

Councilmember Dempster stated he hopes the City gets a little bang for the buck and that the Youth Council won't mimic the City Council, but maybe be an improvement of it.

Vice Mayor Konrad asked if the Youth Council is being patterned off something that already exists and if there were other organizations or Youth Councils within the state to use as a prototype or if this is being created from the ground up with Ms. Thompson stating she got the idea from the Surprise Youth Council, adding she met one of their Youth Council members who said she loves the experience, that her City does something like that and how much of an impact the students can make. Ms. Thompson stated she is not exactly following Surprise because she wants to build from the ground up.

Councilmember Diaz recommended the Youth Council getting a copy of the United States Constitution and the Arizona Constitution.

Ms. Vivian stated another thing to remember is the Youth Council doesn't just shadow the City Council, they can take on their own projects, they can do youth outreach, they can do activities, they can do fundraisers and even travel to the state legislator. Ms. Vivian then stated she took a tour there and it was fascinating, adding there is a lot of things the Youth Council can do in the community.

Mayor King stated it really touches him to get the Youth Council started, adding he has always wanted the school to get involved and understand what the City Council does, noting a lot of people don't know what happens at the City. Mayor King then stated having young people coming in and seeing what happens is good, so they can spread the word. Mayor King then thanked Ms. Lamb for her willingness to take this on as well as everything else she already does.

Councilmember Lambert stated the Council had a couple questions on how the Youth Council was getting started but noted Ms. Thompson will be designing it her way as she will be the Chairman working hand-in-hand with Ms. Vivian, adding it will be a dual effort. Councilmember Lambert stated different cities and how their Youth Councils were started were looked at and Ms. Thompson agreed that the Town of Sahuarita is the one she would like to mold the Youth Council after. Councilmember Lambert then stated he wanted to commend Deputy City Clerk Denise Tapia for spending quite a bit of time on getting information on the Youth Council of Sahuarita and putting it together, so it could be presented to Ms. Lamb and Ms. Thompson.

Councilmember Lambert moved to approve the Resolution 5-2018. Seconded by Councilmember Diaz. Motion passed 7-0.

4. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 6-2018 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, amending the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Budget**

Interim City Manager Vicki Vivian stated the creation of a Benson Youth Council was not contemplated when the 2017-2018 Final Budget was approved by Council and to fund the Youth Council, the City Council would need to approve a General Fund budget transfer. Ms. Vivian then stated Staff is recommending funding in the Community Enrichment Fund for Economic Development be reduced by \$3,500 and the Benson Youth Council under the City Council budget be reactivated and funded with \$3,500. Ms. Vivian then stated any revenue the Youth Council earns will be submitted under the Administration Revenue Budget in the miscellaneous line item, adding this revenue, if any, will be tracked, allowing the revenue to be allocated to the Youth Council in the upcoming budget year.

Mayor King asked if this was something needed now or if it could wait until the new budget with Ms. Vivian stating the League Conference is in August and the City pays for the registrations in May, adding should the Youth Council do any fundraising, it would be in the current fiscal year. Ms. Vivian then stated some expenses in the current fiscal year may include having shirts made and different things like that.

Mayor King stated that explains why the Council needs to move the funding now instead of waiting until the new fiscal year

Vice Mayor Konrad asked what the requested amount was based on and how many would be attending the conference with Ms. Vivian stating she talked to the League and only 6 Youth Council member will be allowed to

attend the conference, along with two chaperones. Ms. Vivian then stated an estimate was received from Sahuarita and included a hotel the night before because the Youth Conference starts at 7:30 a.m., adding the Youth Council can be a part of the flag parade and a part of the procession. Ms. Vivian then stated the amount estimated for the conference is \$1,500 and Staff is requesting an additional \$2,000 be budgeted in case something comes up or the Youth Council wants to do something. Ms. Vivian then stated if the Youth Council brings an idea to the City Council and was approved, the expense would be charged to that line item. Ms. Vivian then stated the Council could reduce the amount of funding, noting it was up to the Council's pleasure.

Vice Mayor Konrad asked if there was a way to fund the Youth Council without manipulating the current budget with Ms. Vivian stating this amendment to the budget is how the Youth Council must be funded, since there is no line item that was allocated for a Youth Council in the current budget. Ms. Vivian then stated State law doesn't allow the Council to increase the budget, so funding would have to be moved from an allocated line item and transferred over. Ms. Vivian then stated the amendment does not have to be done by resolution, but it does need to be approved by the City Council. Ms. Vivian then stated there is \$20,000 in the community enrichment fund that has not been spent, which is why she recommended taking it from there. Ms. Vivian then stated the City Council could also choose to reduce the carry forward amount projected at the end of the fiscal year but noted the community enrichment line seemed like the proper place to seek funding due to the Youth Council being something for the community.

Vice Mayor Konrad asked about delaying the funding request until the first meeting in May or just prior to making reservations for the League conference with Ms. Vivian stating the Council could wait to approve funding, but if the Youth Council held a carwash to raise revenue or wanted to buy shirts or have any other expense, it would have to wait until the Council approved the funding, but it could certainly be put it on a Council agenda at that time if the Council would like.

Vice Mayor Konrad stated he does like the idea of a Youth Council but does not like the idea of manipulating the budget at this stage in the game. Ms. Vivian stated a budget amendment doesn't happen often, but it has been done two other times in the past, adding she did speak to Pat Walker, the City's financial consultant, and Ms. Walker told her the Council doesn't really need a resolution, but the Council does need to take action on it, if they choose to amend the budget to fund the Youth Council at this time.

Councilmember Boyle asked if all the finances that would be spent by the Youth Council would be overlooked by City Staff with Ms. Vivian stating all financial aspects of the Youth Council would be monitored. Councilmember Boyle moved to approve the Resolution 6-2018. Seconded by Councilmember Lambert. Motion passed 5-2 with Vice Mayor Konrad and Councilmember Dempster voting nay.

5. **Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 7-2018 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, approving the application by the Benson Historic Preservation Commission for a Certified Local Government Pass-through Grant administered by the Arizona State Historic Preservation Office for Assistance in Reviewing and Completing an Inventory of Structures on Fourth Street with the goal of Nomination to the National Historic Register**

Planning Technician/GIS Michelle Johnson addressed Council stating at the initiative of the City of Benson Historic Preservation Commission, an inventory of 52 structures along Fourth Street was conducted in 2014. Ms. Johnson then stated the inventory was drafted by a licensed architect, were partially grant funded and were submitted to the State Historic Preservation Office (SHPO) with the intent of evaluating the feasibility of creating a historic district for nomination to the Federal National Register. Ms. Johnson then stated an acceptable federal nomination package has never been submitted to SHPO and in the intervening years, at least one structure has been demolished and others have undergone minor changes. Ms. Johnson then stated though the City is mid-way through the fiscal year 2017 grant cycle, SHPO has grant funding available to continue the pursuit the formation of a historic district. The first phase will be to reevaluate some or all of the 2014 inventory forms and create the nomination strategy, that is, to begin to draft the story of who, how and why Benson's buildings are important and unique. The second phase, to be applied for in the next fiscal year grant cycle, is to create the final nomination package. Both phases will be performed by a licensed architect familiar with SHPO's requirements and having successful nominations in the past. Ms. Johnson then stated the grant application requires a Council resolution confirming support for the endeavor and that matching funds can be supplied, adding SHPO currently has \$10,000.00 available to fund the first phase and the City of Benson must provide a match of only \$1,500.00. Ms. Johnson then stated this will fund the first phase only; another grant application will be submitted to fund the

second phase.

Vice Mayor Konrad moved to approve Resolution 7-2018. Seconded by Councilmember Garner. Motion passed 4-3 with Councilmembers Boyle, Dempster and Diaz voting nay.

6. **Discussion and possible action regarding the safety and profitability of the Benson Municipal Airport to include direction to Staff to proceed with the AEPCO (Arizona Electric Power Cooperative) Revolving Loan Application with final application approval to come before Council in March, 2018**

Interim City Manager Vicki Vivian stated this item has been placed on the agenda at the request of Councilmember Dempster. Ms. Vivian then continued, stating there have been some discussions regarding both safety at the airport and making the airport profitable to include the City installing fuel tanks at the airport and the Airport Manager met with Mr. Geoff Oldfather to gather information on the Arizona Electric Power Cooperative, Inc., (AEPCO) Revolving Loan Program, which is a low-interest program made available to businesses located in the communities they serve, noting eligible entities include federal, state and local organizations, among others. Ms. Vivian then stated one of the goals of the program is to use the funding to foster economic development, adding loans are made in the amount of \$3,000 to \$300,000 depending on the nature of the project. Ms. Vivian then stated in order to qualify for the program funds, there are several requirements that are outlined in the application. Ms. Vivian then stated this item allows the Council to take action regarding the safety and profitability of the airport to include direction to Staff to proceed with the AEPCO (Arizona Electric Power Cooperative) Revolving Loan Application with the final application approval to come before Council in March, 2018.

Councilmember Dempster stated the loan would be for the tank fixed fuel facilities, which would be safer than what is in place now, adding it would be self-serve, so it would double or triple the fuel sales there and the City would gain more income. Councilmember Dempster then stated the loan at zero percent interest is only good a certain amount of time, so if the City starts the application now, the Council can still decide on the final approval later and can then decide on the approval of the facility.

Vice Mayor Konrad stated Mr. Brad Hamilton put a lot of work into this a couple of years ago, and asked Mr. Hamilton for information with Mr. Hamilton stating he did research on this subject in an effort to make the airport pay for itself, adding at the time, he was looking into trying to get the project approved through the FFA grant program, however a fuel farm is considered a money maker and there would be certain restrictions to have it funded with grant money. Mr. Hamilton then stated to do so, the airport air sight improvements must be already done, adding the FFA will not let the City put in tanks with grant funding until the fence and a couple of other project are done, which means the City is looking at least 3-4 years before tanks could be pursued with grant funding. Vice Mayor Konrad asked if the loan presented a more realistic way to get this done and to start bringing money into the airport with Mayor King asking if it would violate any FFA laws or jeopardize any future grants for the airport. Mr. Hamilton stated if the City funds the tanks, the only requirement is to have the project environmentally cleared just like anything else at the airport, then added the airport layout plan would have to be updated to show the facility. Mayor King asked about the cost with Mr. Hamilton stating the environmental clearance would cost approximately \$5,000 and the updated airport layout plan would cost approximately \$2,000. Mayor King asked about the cost of putting in tanks with Mr. Hamilton stating he believes it would be close to \$200,000. Mayor King asked if this was something that would require going through procurement with Mr. Hamilton stating it all depends on if the City has a cooperative purchase agreement. Mr. Hamilton then stated there would be a lot more research that needs to be done. Mayor King stated he just wanted to make sure the City follows policy directly and doesn't break any rules. Councilmember Diaz stated he has concern will already subsidizing the airport.

Councilmember Boyle moved to direct Staff to proceed with the AEPCO (Arizona Electric Power Cooperative) Revolving Loan Application. Seconded by Councilmember Lambert. Motion passed 6-1 with Councilmember Diaz voting nay.

**CALL TO ORDER:**

Mayor King called the meeting to order at 7:03 p.m. with the Pledge of Allegiance. Mayor King then introduced Pastor Kirk Sorensen of the First Assembly of God church to offer the invocation.

**ROLL CALL:**

Present were: Mayor Toney D. King, Sr., Councilmembers Pat Boyle, Larry Dempster, Lupe Diaz, Levi Garner, and David Lambert. Absent was: Vice Mayor Joe Konrad

Mayor King stated Vice Mayor Konrad had a personal issue and was unable to attend the meeting and he was excused.

**EMPLOYEE RECOGNITION:** None

**PROCLAMATION:**

Mayor King read a proclamation declaring the month of April as "Fair Housing Month".

**PUBLIC HEARING:** None

**CALL TO THE PUBLIC:**

Donald L. Buchanan, N. River Rd., St David, was there to talk about a safety concern. Mr. Buchanan stated his background is in manufacturing of hazards and explosive items and thirty years of his career were safety, adding there had been no fatalities while he was on the job. Mr. Buchanan then stated his safety concern is that City Hall has no exit door on the west side and that with all the gates locked, there is only one exit for City Hall. Mr. Buchanan then stated walking out in the yard with prevailing west winds is not a safe place to be in case there's a fire. Mr. Buchanan then stated he was told the door is holding up the building and that if the door is opened, the building will fall down, adding if the door is the only thing holding up the building, there should be barricades to keep the dog walkers and the little kids at the park away from the building. Mr. Buchanan stated its hogwash and he doesn't know who made that decision but if he was sitting on a Council seat, he would fire the guys that made that decision and he would make it stick in court. Mr. Buchanan stated if the City is going to barricade the door, the gates should be unlocked, adding there's only one exit and that is not enough if the room is full of people. Mr. Buchanan thanked the Council for listening.

Ms. Tricia Gerrodette, Eagle Ridge Drive, Sierra Vista, said she wanted to express her gratitude and thanks to Interim City Manager Vicki Vivian for an awesome packet, adding the packet is full of information about what the City is doing and Ms. Gerrodette has been looking for that for a couple of years. Ms. Gerrodette then stated she thinks it's wonderful and Ms. Vivian should be praised for her efforts, adding she appreciates being able to know what's going on.

Mayor King stated he wanted to respond to Mr. Buchanan's comment; then stated the safety concerns were brought to his attention and he wanted to let Mr. Buchannan know the safety concerns are not being overlooked, adding they will be addressed at a future Council meeting.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

### **1. Discussion and possible action on the Consent Agenda**

- 1a. Minutes of the May 22, 2017 Regular Meeting
- 1b. Minutes of the March 12, 2018 Regular Meeting
- 1c. Invoices processed for the period from February 15, 2018 through March 1, 2018

Councilmember Boyle moved to approve the Consent Agenda. Seconded by Councilmember Garner. Motion passed 6-0.

### **2. Discussion and possible action regarding Resolution 10-2018 of the Mayor and Council of the City of Benson, Arizona, authorizing the Transit Specialist to change the Fixed Route and Schedule and add the Flexed Deviated Route and Schedule**

Interim City Manager Vicki Vivian stated Staff is seeking approval and authorization from the City Council to change the Fixed route and schedule and add the Flexed Deviated Route and Schedule (i.e. BAT). There was also a public hearing for the grant application and the schedule changes. Ms. Vivian stated there were no comments at that time, adding Ms. Kathe Williams, Transit Specialist, is here to answer any questions the Council may have.

Councilmember Boyle asked if flexed meant it can change it if we needed. Ms. Williams stated it means that there’s no fixed stops, adding the BAT picks people up at their house and delivers them to Wal-Mart or picks them up at Wal-Mart and takes them back to their houses, noting it is during fixed times and fixed areas, but not fixed stops. Mayor King stated he is excited that the BAT is going to be serving St. David again and thanked Ms. Williams for her work on this.

Councilmember Garner moved to approve Resolution 10-2018. Seconded by Councilmember Diaz. Motion passed 6-0.

### **3. Discussion and possible direction to Staff regarding the “Brighten the Path – the New Face of Benson” event to be held on March 31, 2018 from 7:00 a.m. to noon to clean up trash in Benson**

Interim City Manager Vicki Vivian stated Mr. Elton Bowman and Ms. Pam Masters met with her a few weeks ago, proposing a beautification event they wanted to start, encouraging people to pick up litter in Benson whenever they are walking their dogs or even going for a walk. After referring them to Benson Clean &

Beautiful, they met with her again and asked if the City would be interested in supporting their effort by providing supplies, such as gloves and tools to pick up trash. Ms. Vivian stated with City beautification by cleaning up trash through a roll-off program being approved and put into the budget last year, she engaged the Public Works Director and had him purchase gloves, vests and trash grabbers for use during this event, adding these supplies will also be used in future cleaning events the City may host. Ms. Vivian then stated the Administration office contacted Wal-Mart and they will be supplying the trash bags and will be adding a sign to the City trash receptacles, so participants know where they can dispose of the bags they fill, adding another call was made to the City's contracted sanitation provider, Southwest Disposal, and they graciously offered to place 2 trash receptacles near Goodwill for use in that section of the City. Ms. Thompson, the Administrative Assistant also contacted the San Pedro Valley Chamber of Commerce and any business that would like to participate by allowing trash bags to be disposed of in their trash receptacle will be emailed a sign distinguishing it for use during the event. Ms. Vivian then stated Mr. Elton Bowman and Ms. Pam Masters have requested additional support of the event by providing food for the participants, who will be identified by bracelets (provided by Mr. Elton Bowman and Ms. Pam Masters) they will be given at the start of the event, adding they believe they will have approximately 30 participants. Ms. Vivian then stated for anyone who would like to participate, the event will take place on Saturday, March 31 from 7:00 a.m. to noon, they will be meeting in Lions Park and will be given instructions at that time.

Mayor King stated he had the pleasure of meeting with Mr. Bowman and Ms. Masters and thinks it's going to be an exciting project. Ms. Vivian stated they will focus on public streets and not go into private property or areas that are fenced and will not be picking up hazardous material or anything heavy. Ms. Vivian then stated Mr. Bowman and Ms. Masters hope this becomes a popular event and their hope is to try to do this every spring and every fall.

Councilmember Boyle asked if Mr. Bowman and Ms. Masters came up with this idea on their own and if they were representing anyone one but themselves with Ms. Vivian stating this is completely their own idea.

Mayor King approved to spend up to \$100 to purchase food for the participants. Seconded by Councilmember Dempster. Motion passed 6-0.

4. **Update regarding the Council direction to Staff to proceed with the AEPCO (Arizona Electric Power Cooperative) Revolving Loan Application with final application approval to come before Council in March, 2018**

Interim City Manager Vicki Vivian stated at the February 26, Council meeting, Staff was instructed to proceed with the AEPCO revolving loan application for the possible purchase and installation of fuel tanks at the Benson Municipal Airport. Ms. Vivian then stated the City was notified that Mr. Oldfather, who administers the program was busy for the next few weeks, and that Mr. George Scott would be assisting the City through the process. Ms. Vivian then stated, in addition, Pat Walker, the City's financial consultant, has been working on gathering the necessary financial information for the packet. Ms. Vivian then stated Staff also met with the City's airport consultant who provided additional information on fuel tanks and referred Staff to Mr. Paul Sundby, of American Environmental Aviation, who has provided specs and has constructed almost 1,000 fuel farms. Ms. Vivian then stated Mr. Sundby is also a member of the NFPA 407 Technical Committee. Ms. Vivian then stated she contacted Mr. Sundby and requested specs to be written up so Staff could have the information needed on the different types of tanks and equipment and when the specs are received, the Public Works Director/Airport Manager will be able to contact different suppliers to gather estimates on the equipment and installation costs. Ms. Vivian then stated in conversations to update Mr. Oldfather and Mr. Scott, they suggested that as soon as the financial information is gathered, an application should be completed to request the full \$300,000, and that the application can be amended to a lower amount once the City receives the specs and ensuing estimates. Ms. Vivian then stated since this item was slated to be brought back to Council in March, she wanted to give an update, but no action is required at this time.

Councilmember Boyle moved to adjourn at 7:26 p.m. Seconded by Councilmember Garner. Motion passed 6-0.

## Discussion:

As a policy, one member of the Council and one member of Staff will sign checks, providing one of the many checks and balances the Finance Department maintains; however, should circumstances arise with Staff not being available, two Councilmembers may be asked to sign checks. A procedure will be put into place in the Finance Department to offset this before two Councilmembers are asked to sign checks.

The City purchased some supplies and bottled water for the event, which was held on March 31, from 7:00 a.m. to noon, and engaged partnerships with Wal-Mart to supply garbage bags and Southwest Disposal to place 2 trash receptacles near the former Goodwill location for use in that section of the City. Other businesses that wanted to participate, allowed their trash receptacles to be used the day of the event. In addition, the City Council approved providing pizzas for the volunteers.

Mr. Elton Bowman and Ms. Pam Masters provided bracelets to identify volunteers and were hoping to have approximately 30 participants, but their expectations were exceeded with over 40 volunteers showing up and participating. The area they cleaned up spanned several blocks and approximately 140 45-gallon trash bags were filled with trash. The efforts of everyone involved is greatly appreciated and the work they did made a big contribution to the beautification in our City. Mr. Bowman and Ms. Masters would like to continue this momentum and hold another event in the fall.

The City would like to recognize both Mr. Bowman and Ms. Masters for their inspiration and perspiration, or their willingness to not only lead, but to lead by example, in serving the community. We would also like to recognize all those who volunteered in the event.

## Brightening the Path – Trash removal work draws strong turnout

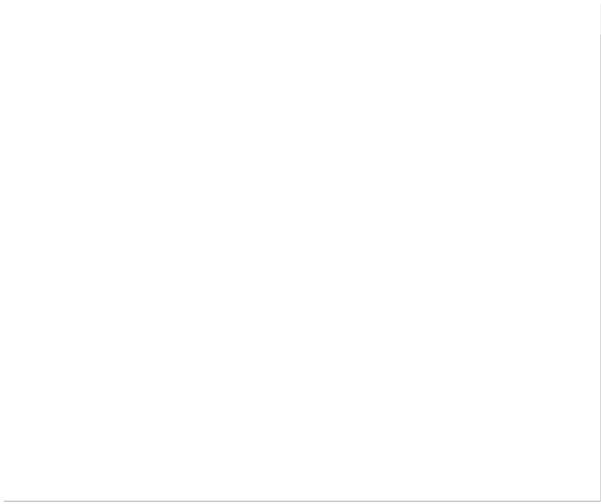
The turnout of volunteers on hand Saturday for the Brighten the Path clean-up project has been hailed a success by organizers Elton Bowman and Pam Masters, pictured in front with their dog, Chewy, who drummed up support for the project.

More than 40 volunteers spent Saturday morning collecting over 7,000 cubic feet of trash during the Brighten the Path cleanup event throughout Benson.

“We expected maybe 30 people but 44 showed up,” said Elton Bowman who coordinated the project with Pam Masters. “Half of the volunteers were regular residents and the other half were snowbirds. We also had some teenagers who took part.”

The group spent four hours filling 140 45-gallon industrial strength trash bags over an area that spanned several city blocks.



“The city put out dumpsters around town that we filled with the bags and then Southwest Disposal emptied them at no cost to the city,” Bowman said.

Several large pieces of trash, such as cement pieces and metal, were encountered that the volunteers couldn't bag.

“We made notes of the locations and the list will be provided to the city so they can send out trucks to pick up what we couldn't,” Bowman said.

After the clean-up the workers were rewarded with a pizza lunch courtesy of a the city and dessert from the Old Benson Ice Cream Stop.

“The volunteers did a fantastic job,” Interim City Manager Vicki Vivian reported. “It was a wonderful thing for them to do.”

Bowman said another cleanup will be held this fall.
